Class Spotlight - 7th Grade

Two of our middle school teachers recently collaborated on a cross-curricular, project-based learning opportunity that is so neat! Our 7th & 8th-grade math and science classes collaborated to research, design, and create a model of a sustainable home. They were given a 50x50 square foot plot of land (they could pick any area on the island to build) and a budget of \$250,000. For the math portion, they needed to have a breakdown of all of their costs, including the rates of all materials used, the total amount spent on each type of material, and the total cost for the entire structure. They also needed to create a scale drawing and model. For the science portion, they researched sustainable appliances, furniture, utility systems, and building materials, in addition to exploring options like gardening and raising chickens. Selecting materials that were both sustainable and affordable was a challenge! And it just so happened that our preschoolers were studying buildings as well, so it offered the perfect opportunity for our middle-schoolers to present their projects to our youngest learners, who voted for their favorite house with a smiley face sticker.
